

## Vermont Agency of Human Services, Home and Community-Based Services Grant Opportunity: Summary of Awards

**Updated May 2024** 

Utilizing funding made available through <u>Section 9817 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021</u>, the Vermont <u>Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) Grant Opportunity</u> is a pivotal initiative aimed at bolstering the quality, accessibility, and sustainability of Vermont's system of care for individuals and their families who rely on HCBS to lead independent and fulfilling lives. Through a competitive application process, HCBS providers, community-based organizations (CBOs) that serve Medicaid members with HCBS needs, and other entities that support the HCBS landscape in Vermont were invited to apply for funding across four tracks. Below is a summary of the 45 awards funded through the HCBS Grant Opportunity.

Infrastructure Improvement	
Organization Name & Type	Project Summary
Bennington Project Independence Adult Day Center	Through the renovation of their Adult Day Center building, Bennington Project Independence will expand program capacity and increase the range and availability of on-site healthcare, personal care, as well as restorative and personal enrichment services for participants.
Counseling Service of Addison County (CSAC) Designated Mental Health and Developmental Disability Services Agency	CSAC will enhance the quality and dependability of transportation services provided to its Developmental Services clients through the purchase of new vehicles. The organization will also contract for an architectural analysis of its current office space and assess whether its program needs exceed current capacity and space configuration.
Elderly Services Adult Day Center	Elderly Services will expand program capacity and improve staff and participant experience by funding comprehensive improvements to the Adult Day Center building's infrastructure, including insulation enhancements, repair of leaks and windows, replacement of an aging chiller with an efficient HVAC geothermal solution, and the installation of solar panels.
Lamoille County Mental Health Services (LCMHS) Designated Mental Health and Developmental Disability Services Agency	LCMHS will replace the roof on its main office building, enabling LCMHS to reopen previously closed sections of the building and create new office spaces for outpatient services. LCMHS will also purchase two new vans to replace aging vehicles for client transportation.
NFI Vermont Specialized Service Agency	NFI's award will allow the agency to remodel The Brattleboro Cottage. It will also fund the installation of a roof-mounted solar voltaic array to produce sustainable energy for the Community Based Services Program and administrative building.
Northern Counties Health Care Home Health Agency	Northern Counties Health Care will fund the replacement of outdated HVAC systems, windows, and a boiler to increase energy efficiency, improve staff experience, and lower energy costs for their Home Health services.



Northwestern Counseling & Support Services (NCSS) Designated Mental Health and Developmental Disability Services Agency	The NCSS award will fund the replacement of aging vehicles and the purchase of vehicle safety equipment to provide dependable client transportation and improve client and staff experience. It will also allow the agency to optimize workflows and communication by purchasing tablets and intake kiosks to allow for real-time health record access.
Springfield Area Adult Day Service, Springfield Hospital Adult Day Center	Springfield Area Adult Day Service will install a nurse call system and upgraded security system to enhance safety for clients and improve the working environment for staff.
Springfield Area Parent Child Center Parent Child Center	Springfield Area Parent Child Center will renovate their newly acquired Training Center building to facilitate high-quality training sessions for HCBS providers in a safe and accessible environment. Renovations include bringing the building entrance into ADA compliance, repairing and painting exterior trim, replacing the roof, and repairing chimney and flue components.
The Gathering Place Adult Day Center	The Gathering Place grant will fund investments and upgrades to its Adult Day Center facility – a Victorian residence dating to approximately 1870 –as well as upgrade aging communication, networking, and software solutions. These improvements will help to strengthen and stabilize the physical environment by addressing safety, energy efficiency and active repair needs, and will improve program delivery as well as client experience.
Washington County Mental Health Services (WCMHS) Designated Mental Health and Developmental Disability Services Agency	The WCMHS grant will fund critical infrastructure improvements to improve safety, accessibility, staff and client experience, and environmental sustainability at its Community Developmental Services program location. Upgrades include replacing the roof, adding an elevator, replacing windows, installing ADA compliant bathrooms and more.
