Medicaid Investment: Customized Employment in Developmental Disabilities Services

Policy Summary:

The Vermont Medicaid program proposes to establish a Medicaid health-related investment to provide customized employment training for the employment support team of individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities overseen by the Vermont Developmental Disabilities Council (VTDDC).

Despite Vermont's strong commitment to employment in Developmental Disabilities Services (DDS), people with higher support needs are being left behind. Families of individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities who have higher support needs report that these individuals are un- or under-employed. Customized employment training is particularly helpful in developing competitive integrated employment opportunities for these individuals. Customized employment is a process through which the relationship between employer and employee is negotiated and personalized in a way that meets the needs of both.

Vermont's Global Commitment to Health Section 1115 Demonstration waiver authorizes expenditures, within annual limits, for public health, health care, and health-related investments. This investment will benefit low income, uninsured, underinsured individuals and Medicaid beneficiaries in Vermont.

Population Affected:

People receiving Developmental Disabilities Services

The estimated gross annualized budget impact is \$29,800.

Project Objective, Targeted Outcomes, and Impact to Health Equity

Families of individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) who have higher support needs report that their family members with I/DD are un- or under-employed. Where jobs have been found, they are for very few hours/week, poorly integrated into a typical job setting, and/or arranged on a volunteer basis. Despite Vermont's strong commitment to employment in Vermont Developmental Disability Services (DDS), people with higher support needs are being left behind.

VTDDC will implement a demonstration project to provide Customized Employment training for the employment support teams of individuals with I/DD. CE is a process through which the relationship between employer and employee is negotiated and personalized in a way that meets the needs of both. While CE can be used for a wide range of job seekers, it is particularly helpful in developing competitive integrated employment opportunities for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) who have relatively high support needs.

Project Description

VTDDC will coordinate enhanced training for the employment support teams of 10 individuals with I/DD. Participating families will have developmental services budgets that are administered by their designated or specialized service agencies or through self/family management. Each individual's team will identify two staff members who will receive training in CE. Up to 20 providers will complete a web-based training as well as receive coaching from a specialist contracted by the VTDDC. Parents will also be able to access coaching.

How does the state ensure there is no duplication of federal funding?

The Agency of Human Services operates under a Cost Allocation Plan (CAP) which is approved quarterly by HHS. The CAP ensures there is no duplication of funding because total expenses are allocated to the benefitting federal program.

Source of non-federal share

State funds equivalent to the amount of federal funds attributable to the increased FMAP.

How does the state ensure that the investment does not include any activities listed in STC 11.6 (Investment Approval Process)?

AHS staff have reviewed project descriptions to ensure that the investment does not include any activities listed in STC #11.5 and will monitor program expenditures to ensure continued compliance with this requirement.

The state assures that in reporting cost, the state and providers must adhere to 45 CFR §75 Uniform Administration Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Health and Human Services (HHS) Awards and 42 CFR §413 Principles of Reasonable Cost Reimbursement. Pursuant to 45 CFR §75.302(a) the state must have proper fiscal control and accounting procedures in place to permit the tracing of funds to a level of expenditures adequate to establish that such funds have not been used in violation of applicable statutes. Costs must be supported by adequate source documentation.
