Any other introductions? 19 20 My name is Courtney Smalt. MS. SMALT: I am with VDH in the SVH Division and I'm the Title 5 21 22 Block Grant Coordinator. 23 MR. DALOZ: Thank you, Courtney. 24 Anyone else? Okay. Just for folks who joined a 25 little bit late, I'm going to go back to the top.

I appreciate everyone taking a moment to join us. And I'm going to take leave with some of the colleagues here.

Good afternoon. Welcome to the Agency of Human Services Block Grant and State Plan hearing. I am Todd Daloz. I respond to he/him pronouns. I am Deputy Secretary of the Agency of Human Services.

Under federal regulation we must prior to the beginning of a new federal fiscal year conduct a public hearing for the following federal Block Grants and State Plans administered by AHS. Those are the Social Services Block Grant, the Preventative Health and Health Services Block Grant, the Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant, the Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Block Grant, the Community Mental Health Services Block Grant, the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant, and Community Services Block Grant.

Under State of Vermont statute we must announce the public hearing as community members have the right to attend meetings of public agencies.

Advertisements of the public hearing were placed in the Burlington Free Press, Bennington Banner, Times

Argus, Brattleboro Reformer, and Rutland Herald on Friday, June 2, of this year. 2023. An electronic notice was also posted on the public libraries' website. Additionally, legislative leaders of the Joint Fiscal Committee were notified via email of this public hearing.

Electronic summary documents as well as full draft grant applications are available on the AHS intranet. Internet, right?

MS. ELMQUIST: Internet.

MR. DALOZ: So they are publicly available. I should note that these Block Grants and State Plans and the respective programs and amounts are for the most part included in the state fiscal year 2024 budget which is yet to be enacted. Until the federal fiscal year '24 budget is enacted into law, we will submit our plans using the estimated allocations based on FFY 2023 funding levels.

At this point we will take questions from the public. As you heard in the introduction, the individuals present today are members of each department who will address any specific concerns or questions regarding these grants and plans. We will record your questions and provide a formal written response as soon as possible to those questions.

In addition, we will post all questions and answers on the Agency of Human Services' website.

I'm going to leave this open now for any questions from any members of the public who have joined.

(No response)

MR. DALOZ: Folks can feel free to raise hands or speak out as questions arise. In the interest of providing sufficient opportunities for the public to weigh in, if they haven't arrived at the meeting at this moment, we will leave the line open for an additional 20 minutes in the event that a member of the public has a question.

So folks should feel free to mute themselves, but please be ready to answer any questions should a member of the public arrive within the next 20 minutes, by my clock if we haven't heard from a member of the public by 2:33, we will close the meeting.

MR. DALOZ: Hi, folks. We have waited 10 minutes. And if anyone has joined us in the last few minutes, as a reminder this is the AHS Block Grant and State Plan hearing. We are leaving this line open for another 10 minutes in case any members of the public have joined us and have any questions.

As I -- maybe if you didn't hear, but individuals on this call are available to answer any specific questions or concerns regarding the Block Grants that are the subject of today's hearing. We will record any questions asked and provide formal written responses to the question afterwards as soon as possible. And we will also post all questions and answers to the Agency of Human Services' website.

So at the end if there are any questions from the members of the public, feel free to ask them or put them in the chat. We are happy to take them that way. We will leave this line open for another 10 minutes. Thanks.
