GCR 22-068 PROPOSED

<u>Medical Nutrition Therapy – Registered Dietitian Services</u>

Policy Summary:

The Vermont Medicaid program proposes to remove the visit limits for medical nutrition therapy (MNT) services delivered by registered dietitians. Medicaid-enrolled dietitians may deliver MNT as medically necessary for the management of a medical condition and must maintain documentation of medical necessity for services provided.

MNT must be provided by a registered dietitian certified to practice in Vermont and working as part of a multidisciplinary approach delivering services as prescribed by the beneficiary's physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice registered nurse. MNT is nutritional diagnostic, therapy, and counseling services for the management of a medical condition. MNT includes individualized dietary assessment that is more complex than basic nutrition counseling. Other licensed providers may provide basic nutritional counseling as within their scope of practice.
