<u>Health Care Administrative Rules Update – Private Nonmedical</u> Institutions and Long-Term Care Rules

Policy Summary:

The Agency of Human Services (AHS) has filed the following adopted rules with the Office of the Secretary of State (SOS) and the Legislative Committee on Administrative Rulemaking (LCAR):

5.101 Methods, Standards, and Principles for Establishing Medicaid Payment Rates for Long-Term Care Facilities

Amended to follow the HCAR style format for adoption under HCAR and moved items
that do not need the effect of rule into the accompanying manual. The remaining
revisions detail the administrative processes surrounding per diem rates set by the
Division.

5.102 Methods, Standards and Principles for Establishing Payment Rates for Private Nonmedical Institutions Providing Residential Child Care Services

Amended to follow the HCAR style format for adoption under HCAR and moved items
that do not need the effect of rule into the accompanying manual. The remaining
revisions detail the administrative processes surrounding per diem rates set by the
Division.
