Social Services Block Grant funds are used to purchase residential treatment services with 24hour supervision, professional staffing, and structured programming from designated agencies; and to enable people with severe mental illness to obtain and remain in decent, affordable, integrated housing through the provision of community supports and service coordination along with related support services for daily living. The principal indicators of goal accomplishment are admissions to the Vermont State Hospital, the number of Community Rehabilitation and Treatment clients served, and bed days in therapeutic community residences. <u>Funded programs</u> <u>have contributed to reductions in Vermont State Hospital admissions and average daily in-house census.</u>
